## ***KENTUCKY CLUB LAMB ASSOCIATION INFORMATION SHEET***

### **WHAT IS IT:**

The Kentucky Club Lamb Association (KCLA) is an educational not-for-profit association organized under the laws of the State of Kentucky

### **WHAT ARE THE OBJECTIVES:**

1. The purpose is to provide an organized voice for representing and promoting the club lamb and sheep industry in Kentucky. **It is the prime directive to support all junior market lamb activities and junior show participants within the State of Kentucky.**
2. To arrange for state sponsored shows and/or sales when conditions are favorable and a majority of the members desire such a show and/or sale to be held.
3. To arrange for exhibits, demonstrations and/or training at local and other fairs or exhibitions as may be desired by the members or requested by youth project leaders. To be a resource for any youth or group wishing to begin and develop the market lamb project.
4. To work with, and for, the promotion of the sheep industry within the State of Kentucky. It will be the goal of the association to work for one unified industry within the State. The association expects a working relationship with the Kentucky Sheep & Wool Producers Association, the KY Dept of Agriculture, 4-H, FFA, and any other organization while striving to attain this objective.

### **WHO ARE MEMBERS:**

Any person living in the State of Kentucky who is interested in the production, merchandising, or promotion of the club lamb industry and club lamb project is eligible for membership. Breeders who sell club lambs to junior KCLA member need to be members so youth can receive “KCLA KY BRED POINTS”. All junior exhibitors in the State of Kentucky wishing to compete in the Point Award Competition must be a paid member before he/she can begin earning show points. Yearly dues are \$10.00. Only current members will be entitled to voting privileges, one vote per member.

### **IMMEDIATE GOAL:**

**To promote club lamb activity and the market lamb project throughout the state.** The sheep project is one of the most educational and character-building project a youth can take. They learn countless life lessons throughout the experience of feeding, showing, and perhaps owning their own flock. The KCLA is trying to add to the fun of the show season, helping set goals, and rewarding more hard-working youth than ever before. We feel this program, while in no way a part of 4-H or FFA is a perfect compliment and promotes increased family participation. In the process we are able to showcase the outstanding lambs being raised in Kentucky and hopefully keep more of the purchases in the state. Several consignors to the KCLA sale are current or past 4-H and FFA members.

### **KCLA ANNUAL CLUB LAMB SALE:**

A club lamb sale sponsored by the Kentucky Club lamb Association is held every spring. This sale is the primary **fundraiser** for the KCLA and a showcase to promote Kentucky bred market lambs. It is open to Kentucky Club Lamb Breeders. The breeders who consign to this sale are paying an entry fee to the KCLA. The lambs purchased at this sale by KCLA members receive 3 points for each lamb, up to 6 lambs, toward their lamb “KCLA KY BRED POINTS”

### **POINTS AWARD COMPETITION:**

Youth members accumulate points at district and Jr. Livestock Expos lamb shows, state fair, and “point show” county fairs that they attend for lamb placing and showmanship. A complete list of shows for 2007 will be available. Showing Kentucky bred lambs also accumulates points by completing a “KCLA KY BRED POINT” form. Youth who purchase lambs at the KCLA sale receive 3 points per lamb. Lambs bred and raised by a member will receive 3 points per lamb. Lambs purchased from KCLA member Kentucky breeder quality for 3 points per head. A total of a maximum six lambs per youth. Leadership and Community Service in the sheep industry is an important part of KCLA and youth can receive up to 5 points per activity up to a total of 15 points. To receive points for “KCLA BRED POINTS” and “LEADERSHIP & COMMUNITY SERVICE” forms must be obtained and completed and turned in by deadline.

To qualify for any awards in the four divisions’ youth, members must have 100 points. Novice member only need 50 points.
